

HOLY WEEK and EASTER SERVICES







PALM SUNDAY was the beginning of Holy Week - a week of celebrations starting with the remembrance of Jesus' victorious entry into Jerusalem. The church and church grounds were decorated with palm branches and hand woven palm crosses given to everyone, symbolising the ultimate sacrifice, and victory, of Christ. (Other than this traditional meaning, it is an "old wives tale" to keep a palm cross in your home to protect against house fires!)











A number of services we held during Holy Week including Maundy Thursday's Foot Washing and Stripping of the Alter and Good Friday

As the encroaching darkness of the Maundy Thursday liturgy draws us more deeply into the drama of our Lord's passion, we witness the stripping of the altar - an ancient ritual reminding us of the stripping of Christ when he fell into the hands of the Jews who only days before had lauded his entry into Jerusalem. The altar linens, paraments and Eucharistic vessels are removed, the Blessed Sacrament is removed from the Aumbry and placed upon the Altar of Repose (representing the Garden of Gethsemane), the Sanctuary lamp extinguished, and finally we hear the harrowing words of Psalm 88.





On Easter Day we renewed our Baptism Vows and also welcome into the Body of Christ Maya and Daniel (see photos on page 1). We continue to uphold them in our prayers as they continue on their lifelong journeys of faith. Celebrating the mystery of the resurrection, we gathered in word and in sacrament with shouts of Alleluia! We now enter into the season of Easter, continuing to share in the great 50 days of the season of celebrating the joy and mystery of the resurrection.



In April, we welcomed Claire from Wontulp Bi Buya Theological & Ministry College in Cairns North Queenslan.

Claire wrote:

What a privilege it has been for me this past week to share in worship with the Kempsey Anglican All Saints Parish community. Diversity is just one of the many aspects of our faith communities that I love. I work at Wontulp Bi Buya Theological & Ministry College in Cairns North Qld, an Anglican partnership delivering theological training to Aboriginal & Torres Strait Island people in their communities. At the heart of the college is the Gospel message of salvation through Christ & the great commandment - to love God & to love our neighbour, meeting people, where we all are in our human brokenness, and sharing God's Word, with Christ as our example. This commandment of love for one other has led me to begin the steps toward ordination, in particular, the Order of Deacon. The Body of Christ is one of diversity, a multi-faceted expression of the fruits of the spirit through service & worship that transcends cultural, socio-economic & geographical boundaries. We journey in Christ together, bound in common faith & worship, the warmth and welcome of All Saints Kempsey affirms this to me

Sometimes it's just rubbish :(

OP SHOP NEWS: When donating our unwanted clothes to the op shop most people would go away with a self-congratulatory feeling of a good deed done! While our Op Shop gratefully receives and appreciates an enormous amount of good quality donations for resale, an equally enormous amount of "rubbish" passes through our doors - food waste, dirty nappies, soiled old and ripped clothing, broken shoes, mouldy books, broken toys and china (the list could go on and on). This all ends up on our sorting table - rubbish that belongs in the bin. Unfortunately this eats into the small profits we make with 3-4 ute loads going to the tip every week! Please spare a thought for our hard working volunteers, who on a daily basis, are sorting through piles of unwanted items.

So, what can we do to make this better?

- Encourage people to think "if I wouldn't wear it is not worth donating" : put it in the rubbish bin or recycle
- Encourage people to think "if it has a chip in it it's not for sale": put it in the bin / we don't sell any broken items
- Encourage people to bring their donations to the op shop during trading hours - leaving items in the curb side bin or on the op shop veranda usually results in items ruined by the weather or sorted through by passer-bys / scavengers, and so it never makes it to the op shop

We are always grateful for saleable donations - not only does it help raise funds for the wider work in the parish, we also give away a lot of items to families in need or people who are starting out. Finally, we are very grateful and give thanks for our wonderful, dedicated volunteer workers.
