

ALL SAINTS' DAY 2022

It was wonderful to welcome Bishop Murray Harvey to join with us in celebrating our Patronal Festival on October 30th 2022! We give thanks to God for the life and witness of all those Saints down the ages whose work and ministry continues to enliven our faith and understanding. Throughout the month of October we spent time in a Season of Saints, reflecting on the lives of well-known (and some lesser known!) Saints.

Our brother Stephen Liddelow was Confirmed in the faith, something he has been incredibly excited for. "I have waited 28 years for this!" he said. At the age of 66, Stephen's faith continues to grow and encouraged by regular reading of the scriptures, prayer, and attending public worship.

Our worship was made all the richer with the wonderful Macleay Music Ensemble and Mr Ross Newton on the Organ, as well as our All Saints' Singers! We gathered in the Parish Hall afterwards, and enjoyed a delicious bring and share morning tea. Bishop Murray was presented with a handcarved pectoral cross, made by our own Mrs Jane Lewis, as a gift celebrating his four year anniversary as our Bishop in Grafton.

Following morning tea, we joined with our brothers from the Roman Catholic Church. Bishop Greg Homeming O.C.D the Bishop of the Diocese of Lismore, and Father James Foster of Macleay Valley Catholic Parish met with Bishop Murray and Father Jesse for coffee and fellowship. In the evening, Bishop Murray joined with ministers of the Parishes of Kempsey, Wauchope and Lower Macleay for a meal overlooking the Macleay River.

On Monday, October 31st 2022, Bishop Murray joined with Bishop Peter Stuart of the Diocese of Newcastle to attend the Grand Opening of the new headspace, located on Smith Street. headspace Kempsey is a centre that operates on Dunghutti land. This service is funded by the Federal Government and managed by Healthy North Coast to provide mental health, physical health, alcohol and other drug, and vocational/educational supports to young people in the Kempsey and surrounding areas. This work is delivered by the Samaritans, the social justice mission arm of the Anglican Church in Newcastle.

We give thanks to God for his ongoing outpouring of grace upon our Valley, and continue to pray that we may continue to be vessels of his love, light and peace.

ALL SOULS' DAY 2022

We came together in faith and love to pray for God's eternal rest in the sure and certain hope of the resurrection. The names and photographs of our loved ones who have died were offered in prayer, with candles lit in Church at an All Souls' Requiem Mass. Fr Jesse prayed the Office of the Dead at West Kempsey, East Kempsey, Frederickton, Euroka, Tom's Gully and Bellbrook Cemeteries, and was joined with those whose loved ones find their resting place in those tranquil surrounds. They joined to gather to pray, sing hymns, and to reflect. We pray that All Souls will continue to hear God's voice drawing them into his peace.

There's something soul-stirring that happens as we come together with our family and friends to sing Christmas carols. I remember as a child we kept the tradition of decorating the Christmas tree - weaving colourful lights and tinsel around its branches, and placing glittering baubles. In the the warm glow of these memories humming in the background is a well-worn, oft-rewound VHS tape: 'Wiggly, Wiggly Christmas.' (I recently turned 30 - figure now I qualify to mutter "back in my day!")

As my siblings and I "helped" decorate the tree, we danced in our brand new (!) Christmas pyjamas joyfully singing to The Wiggles' renditions of 'Away in a Manger', 'Silent Night', and 'Ding Dong Merrily On High'. For so many people who, like me, did not grow up going to Church, these Carols expound upon one of the few Christian stories that we know. The Christmas story is so ingrained in our understanding that it shapes our experience as humans and as Australians. The values of love, joy, peace hope and forgiveness that we hold dear are inspired by the Incarnation of Jesus.

The heart of the Christmas gospel draws us into the love story of God and His people. The God who loved us so much that he gave his only Son, in order that we might be drawn nearer to His nature, mercy, peace, reconciliation and love. Whatever your family tradition might be, I encourage you to dance in your new pyjamas, singing the carols that for generations have inspired faith, hope, and joy.
